Hello and welcome to what should be the 9th annual edition of the Nevrekar News. You may be wondering where in the world this branch of Nevrekars has gone off to. Well, we have now moved to India. Yes, India. This is the third country Anand & Zareen have lived in since they got married in 1999. This brings the total number of moves up to – since our wedding – a grand total of 6 moves. (We're not counting the moves within postal/zip codes right now, so that's it.)

At the end of 2006, Anand started to get really great offers of international contract jobs that we felt were just too tempting not to consider. Thanks to Anand's fantastic experience at AirTran Airways, with becoming a Captain on the Boeing 737-700, we actually had options to contemplate. Actually, we were pretty happy at our little home at Longwood Place in Jonesboro, but still felt a little on-coming wanderlust. At the same time, we felt that there were other long-term goals that were becoming more and more difficult to implement. 1. Zareen is a major proponent of bilingual education, and we wanted that for the kids quite strongly. 2. The other part of the equation is that we have three kids to raise & educate and current savings, earnings, & other mundane concerns made top-notch private schooling for all three prohibitively expensive. (Mama wants to buy new shoes every now and then!) 3. There are excellent international schools here in India that are a fraction of the cost and offer so many amenities that we could not even anticipate. By the way, the medium of instruction at these schools is English, but here Hindi

is compulsory from the get-go so we get to kill those two birds with the proverbial stone.

We were blessed enough to sell our house quickly. (How quickly – our agent hadn't even put up the for sale sign before we received our first offer for our sale price!) But selling the house proved to be the most successful part of our moving process. We tried to sell our cars, quite a bit of our furniture, TVs, computers, radios, as well as other items, but with very little luck. Anyways, we're here now and the things we couldn't get rid of are now in storage.

Asher (6½) is attending Scottish High International School where he is involved with public speaking, out-of-state camps, arts & crafts, horse riding, yoga, soccer, tae kwon do, basic computer skills, & swimming. Coming to India has been quite a challenge for Asher, what with saying goodbye to school, friends, and familiar surroundings. He has, however, risen to the hopes and expectations that our moving here brought on. Asher is learning to read, write, and speak in Hindi – although the effort of doing so is racing him ahead of his mom, Zareen, who is completely at sea with that language. Zareen is able to speak & understand Hindustani (a mix of Hindi & Urdu) but not read or write it; which is not particularly surprising considering she grew up in Jonesboro, Georgia where there really aren't a lot of places you would need to speak anything besides English.

Zara, now 3, has also gotten admission to Scottish & will start in April 2008. Anand and Zareen are hoping that the family princess will be potty-trained before then, but who knows? As far as we can tell, Zara really enjoys not having to deal with mundane personal hygiene issues, so she may never be motivated to move beyond the spa experience of having someone else take care of all that for her.

Kaif is almost 19 months old. He is walking, turning off all sorts of appliances, dreaming in Hindi, and having loads of fun being the baby of the family. At his most recent weigh-in, Kaif was only 6kgs less than his older brother.

All three kids are now speaking Hindi in addition to English with varying degrees of fluency. By the by, Anand & Zareen are also improving with regard to speaking the local language. Keep in mind that India is the land of “accreditation” with regard to money and to pressurize someone is to put the squeeze on

them. As far as local customs, we've had to get used to the fact that traffic laws are merely guidelines and stop lights are kindly suggestions from local law enforcement.

We've been quite lucky to land where we have because we had help from local family members in doing almost everything. Zareen's cousins, in particular, have helped us in finding suitable household & childcare employees, smoothing out difficulties as they arise, advising us, and introducing us to very interesting people, places, and things.

Since we've arrived in India, we have been able to have a number of adventures. There have been tiger sightings (out on the “range,” not at home), trips to palaces (both new and old), shopping (high- and low-end), and yearnings for real hamburgers, real steaks...maybe this summer?

In the meantime, we will hope to hear from you, our friends and family, and see you if we're really blessed. We would love to host both real and virtual visits from any and all who would like to tarry a bit with us here. We look forward to connecting with friends and family, past, present and future in 2008. If your travel plans ever include the Indian Subcontinent, then we certainly would be delighted to offer our home and hospitality.
